



Dear Parent/Guardian,

We're excited that your child would like to join the Victory Life Kids Internship program! This means that they are not just content to sit and be served; they want to serve others. Servanthood is an essential step on their journey to spiritual maturity. We don't usually invite kids into the Internship program nor do we present it as fun or of personal benefit, so we are always pleased when of their own will, they express the desire to serve their peers.

In the Internship program, the kids will be taught how to lead the right way; by presenting a good example, not by being bossy. They will learn that real leadership means being a servant to those you lead, following Christ's example. They will learn that the more they grow in leadership, the more they have to leave selfishness behind.

We believe this will be an excellent experience for your child!

Before we get started, the applicant must meet the following criteria:

- The applicant must be no younger than 10 years old.
- The applicant must be a born-again believer.
- The applicant must have a desire to live an overcoming life.
- The applicant must have a desire to serve.
- The Applicant must have a written recommendation for the internship for one of their children's church leaders.
- The applicant must agree in writing to the Internship conduct policy.



Please carefully read and complete the following

INTERN RULES

1. Be a good example for the other kids.
2. Obey your leaders*
3. Serve with a servant's heart
4. Participate in all class activities

It is important for the prospective intern to understand that as an Intern the student is *still a member of the class*. They are not given any special treatment, nor are they exempt from any normal classroom rules. Checking the boxes below means that the prospective intern understands each line and agrees to abide by these rules.

- Interns must not be up and walking around when the class is seated.
- Interns must not be seated when the class is standing.
- Interns must not talk when the class is supposed to be quiet.
- Interns must participate in all classroom activities including the memory verse, praise and worship, the lesson, small group time, game time, etc.
- Interns, just like every other student, must not leave class without the teacher's permission
- Interns must not enter children's church before the doors are opened for all students.
- Interns must not check themselves in or out of class.

CONSEQUENCES

If an intern breaks one of these rules, they will be given a clear warning. If the intern chooses to ignore this warning their teacher is **REQUIRED** to take the intern's badge and turn it into the Internship Director.

The Internship Director will then determine, based on the severity of the infraction and the intern's history, if it is appropriate for the Intern to be permanently or temporarily removed from the Internship.
